
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### Dual Enrollment Equity Pathways

Entry into baccalaureate major at a 4-year institution


> Community college transfer program aligned to 4-year major


Workforce program aligned to high-wage/high-demand career

# Dual Enrollment

Dual enrollment refers to college course-taking by students who are simultaneously enrolled in high school or adult education programs.





\*CCAP - College and Career Access Pathways

## Non-CCAP Dual Enrollment

- Qualified high school students may enroll in up to 11 units of college courses per term as SPECIAL ADMIT students.
- Students may enroll in the courses on college campus or open-access courses held at the high school campus.





## CCAP Dual Enrollment


- Closed courses at high school campuses during the school day
- Maximum of 15 units of college credits per term
- College fees are waived
- Creates key college access points for underrepresented students



# Early College Program

- CA Department of Education Middle/Early College Grant
- Innovative partnership with Napa Valley Unified
  School District and New Technology High School
- Allows high school students to earn a high school diploma and up to two years of college credit in four years or less





- through a High School Articulation Agreement.

## High School Articulation

• High school courses are comparable to a specific college course

• Determination is made through collaboration between a high school teachers and NVC discipline faculty/coordinator and formalized

• Students may earn college credit by completion of the high school course with a grade of B or higher, and apply the course to NVC



## Dual Enrollment Ambassador Program

Unique leadership opportunity for current dual enrolled students to support recruitment and enrollment for NVC, promote student engagement, increase awareness of NVC's services and programs, foster pride in the NVC community, and act as liaisons between NVC and the high school

## Legislative Updates

### AB 368 (Holden)

- Clarified that CCAP students may take up to 15 units per semester, without fees, regardless of course location (high school or college)
- Assigned priority enrollment to **CCAP** students


• Authorized community schools, juvenile hall schools, adult education programs, and county offices of education to enter into CCAP agreements

### Title 5 Section 56700

- Parental consent to admit a student to a community college dual enrollment course shall apply to all community college dual enrollment courses attempted by the student until parental or guardian consent is withdrawn in writing.
- Community colleges shall not require students to provide high school transcripts or social security numbers as a condition of dual enrollment.
