Homework	Reading and writing assignments from the textbook or from online resources such as www.eureka.org.
Projects	Research project on occupations that correspond to one's assessment results, different occupations within a specified industry and college majors that correspond to one's assessment results.

Portfolios	Job search portfolio consisting of a current sample application, resume, references, skill samples, etc.
Oral Presentations	Final oral presentation demonstrating knowledge and experienced gained from job shadow or informational interview assignment.
