Activity	For example, students will engage in a debate involving a contemporary issue facing the LGBT community.
Critique	For example, review an educational initiative or activism activity related to the LGBT community that actually occurred and critique the tactics and methods used.
Discussion	For example, discuss current views of different religions of LGBT family structures and marriage.
Field Trips	For example, a field trip to tour an LGBT non-profit organization.
Lecture	For example, an interactive lecture using socratic questions about related course content.
Projects	For example, design an educational initiative or activism activity related to a contemporary issue facing the LGBT community.
Visiting Lecturers	For example, an executive director of an organization that supports aspects of the LGBT community.

Methods of Evaluation

Types	Examples of classroom assessments
Exams/Tests	For example, a multiple-choice or short essay exam covering assigned reading, videos media, and class content.
Projects	Research Projects - For example, research an LGBT serving non-profit organization and prepare a presentation on the mission and goals of the organization. Projects - For example, select a contemporary issue facing the LGBT community and design an educational initiative or activism activity related to the issue. Group Projects - For example, work with a small group of other students to deliver an educational initiative or activism activity related to a contemporary issue facing the LGBT community.
Homework	For example, read an article about a contemporary issue facing the LGBT community and writing a summary that includes an analysis of the issue and its greater impact on society.

Assignments

Reading Assignments

Reading Assignments may include selected studies, news articles from print or Internet publications, or handout materials provided by the instructor.

For example:

- 1. Read "Discrimination against Law Enforcement Officers on the Basis of Sexual Orientation and Gender Identity: 2000 to 2013."
- 2. Read an article from a current LGBT news publication or local newspaper relating to the LGBT community.
- 3. Read an article from an online LGBT news source, such as www.advocate.com related to the topic discussed in class.

Writing Assignments

Writing Assignments that require students to think critically about reading assignments, class discussions, or guest speakers. For example:

- 1. Select an article from a current LGBT news publication and write a summary of the article.
- 2. Write a research paper about a successful educational program or campaign related to the LGBT community.
- 3. Write a research paper about an advocacy or support organization directly serving the LGBT community.

Other Assignments

Other Assignments may include supplementing classroom activities with group projects, research projects, and field trips. For example:

- 1. Work with other students to create an educational program or campaign related to the LGBT community.
- 2. Work with other students to deliver an educational program or campaign related to the LGBT community.
- 3. A field trip to an advocacy or support organization directly serving the LGBT community.
