3. Sing with expanded range and flexibility of voice, according to the demands of the repertoire.
4. Sing complex melodic line with accuracy within a complex harmonic structure.
5. Pronounce language accurately and intelligibly, with awareness of articulation for singing and language communication.
6. Collaborate musically and interpretively in rehearsal and performances with the pianist.
7. Sing with appropriate subtext and emotional expression using appropriate gestures and facial expression.
8. Translate and transcribe repertoire where appropriate.
9. Select and perform repertoire from composer-arranged popular songs, folk songs, art song, opera and/or oratorio.
10. Maintain an individual practice schedule to develop complex musicianship and technical vocal skills.
