5.	Demonstrate effective therapeutic communication techniques when interacting with patients with mental disorders.
6.	Apply the nursing process, using holism as a basis in the care of the mentally ill individual.
7.	Collaborate with the mental health team in the development of an appropriate plan of care for the suicidal client and those with thought, mood, and dissociative disorders.
8.	Utilizing the nursing process, develop and implement an appropriate plan of care for the suicidal client as well as those with thought, mood, and dissociative disorders based on the identified needs.
9.	Describe the impact of grief and loss on the mental health of the individual.
10.	Utilizing the nursing process, develop an appropriate plan of care for the client with anxiety disorder based on the identified needs.
11.	Demonstrate cultural competence in the interactions with clients and staff.
12.	Describe the impact of culture on treatment of psychiatric patients.
13.	Demonstrate the principles of therapeutic communication when interacting with clients and staff.
14.	Apply the concepts of biological, psychological, sociological, cultural, and spiritual factors that affect the client and family affected by mental disorders, violence, and/or addictive disorders to the care of the mentally disordered client.
15.	Identify the growth & development needs of the client with disorders usually diagnosed in infancy, childhood, or adolescence.
16.	Discuss the nutritional needs of the client with mental disorders.
17.	Demonstrate appropriate methods of drug administration.
18.	Maintain safe environment for those with mental disorders.
19.	Identify therapeutic modalities and their implications in the care of patients with mental disorders.
20.	Discuss the pharmacological agents used in the treatment of mental disorders.
