Initially approve AP 4105 Distance Education as recommended by the AS Executive Committee.

- Document reflects new Title 5 changes and federal regulations changes.
- Developed by a taskforce of curriculum committee members and members from DE workgroup.
- Reviewed by curriculum committee and executive committee.
- We no longer have to do separate approval of DE. It will be incorporated in the regular COR process.
- New language about instructor contact now termed regular and substantive interaction. Language in the AP is taken directly from the federal code of regulations.
- Added information about accessibility.
- 7. **Discussion Item** (20 mins)
 - 7.1 Policy Revision- Powell & Tejada

Dr. Powell will discuss the plan to move forward with the mutually agreed upon (Collegial Consultation) policy review and its assessment.



- Academic Senate

 Powell: CIA visit was helpful for all stakeholders, providing a shared base of understanding about how community governance is supposed to work, emphasizing good communication and relationships
- Our processes should be mutually agreed up on and followed.
- CIA recommended we revisit AP 2410, assess it, determine changes or revisions.
- President Powell and Dr. Tejada sent a formal request for the state senate and league to send over facilitators to help council of presidents assess and make recommendations.
- Tejada: We will be using the version of 2410 that was mutually agreed upon, not the one Frost put forward.
- Powell: Changes and revisions will go through collegial consultation. We need to honor the existing process and utilize outside help. CoP will have an additional member from each constituent group.
- Tejada: There are existing APs that need to complete the process. CoP will use 9 of them to go through the process and assess at the same time.
- Powell: Our processes may seem inefficient to outsiders, but they allow us to vet thoroughly and ensure what gets approved is understood and effective. Something that goes through curriculum first should not come back with significant changes. There is substantial committee expertise there.
- Tejada: Our committees are not independent of the senate. This senate as a whole is the recommending body.
- Ethnic Studies APs will also move through the process.
- Faculty question: Are we using versions that the board approved in Spring or templates?
- Tejada: BOT wanted to correct some past decisions but may have overstepped. There is a lot happening behind the scenes to re-establish positive relationships.
- Faculty comment: Senate is pretty clear what to do with a policy when it comes to us for review. Other constituent groups have not had a clearly defined process for when a policy comes to them. Hopefully helping them develop an approach will build confidence and trust in institutional processes overall.

8.1 IEPI Grant Professional Learning Update- Tejada

The AS President will give an update on the IEPI grant and associated activities.

- DE and CRP and governance institute are engaging in curriculum development.
- DE and CRP are working on level 2 and looking into using noncredit as a model to pay participants and trainers.
- CRP and governance institute teams are multi-constituent.
- Governance is looking at two pathways, one for new employees and one for future constituent leaders.
- Professional Learning group is writing new bylaws and looking for how to make connections to other professional development structures.
- PRT visit will probably happen in November.



8.2 Peer Online Course Review (POCR) Process- Pruitt

The Distance Education (DE) & Educational Technology (ET) Committee chair will review the AS approved POCR process.

- Faculty are invited to review the DE Plan that the senate passed in Fall 2020, available on the DE-ETC web page under the senate. It outlines the POCR process.
- We will be looking for volunteers for Spring, ideally people who have completed the IDI, which focused on areas A-C of the rubric.
- POCR pairs a faculty member with another faculty member in a supportive and collaborative experience.
- This is not related to evaluation or clearance.
- Is this going to replace clearance? No
- Faculty are encouraged to get involved.
