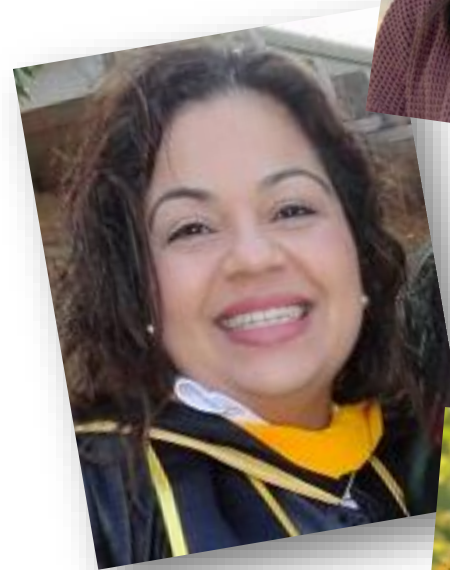
What is EOPS?

Extended Opportunity Programs and Services

EOPS is a state-funded, community college program designed to assist students by providing “over and above and in addition to” the services already offered at a community college.

EOPS Counseling

- ✓ Academic counseling
- ✓ Educational planning
- ✓ Personal counseling
- ✓ Career guidance
- ✓ Transfer assistance



EOPS Services

- ✓ Priority Registration
- ✓ Book Voucher Program
- ✓ Tutoring Services
- ✓ Transfer Assistance
- ✓ College Success Workshops
- ✓ Coordination with other academic support services on campus



Who is eligible?

- ✓ Full time students (12 units)
- ✓ California residents (including AB540 students)
- ✓ Completed less than 70 degree applicable units
- ✓ Applied for financial aid (via the FAFSA or CA Dream Act)
- ✓ Eligible for a California College Promise Grant (*formerly Board of Governors Fee Waiver*) under Method A or B with 0 EFC.
- ✓ In need of educational support services

NEXTUP

NextUp is a supplemental component of the EOPS program that specifically assist EOPS students who are current or former foster youth attending Napa Valley College, by providing additional services already provided by the EOPS program.

Eligibility:

- ✓ Submit an EOPS application
- ✓ Be a current or former foster youth on or after their 13th birthday
- ✓ Be under 26 years of age before July 1st of the academic year in which the student enrolls in the program
- ✓ Working towards enrollment in 9 units

CARE



The Cooperative Agencies Resources for Education (CARE) program provides additional services to EOPS students who are single, head-of-household parents, receiving CalWORKs or TANF cash aid benefits.

● Eligibility:

- ✓ Submit an EOPS application
- ✓ Be single and head of the household parent
- ✓ Be themselves or their children receiving county benefits
- ✓ Enroll in at least 12 unit at NVC
