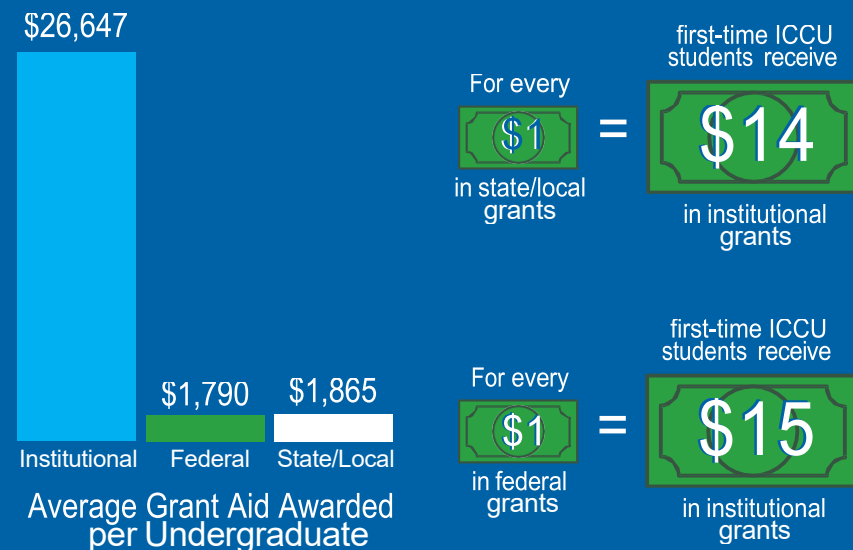

Net Tuition and Fees at ICCUs

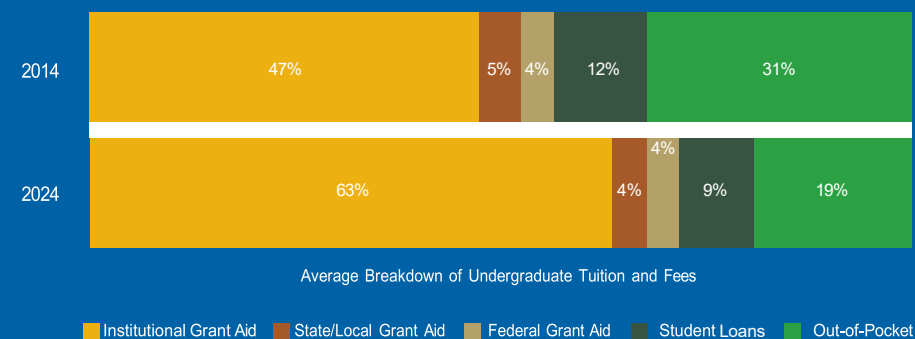
Institutional grants account for **more than 7 times** the amount of federal and state/local grants combined

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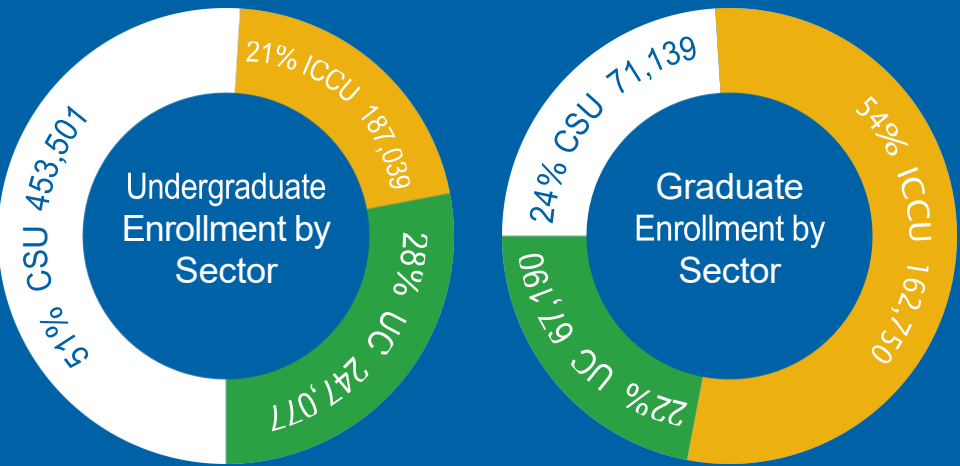

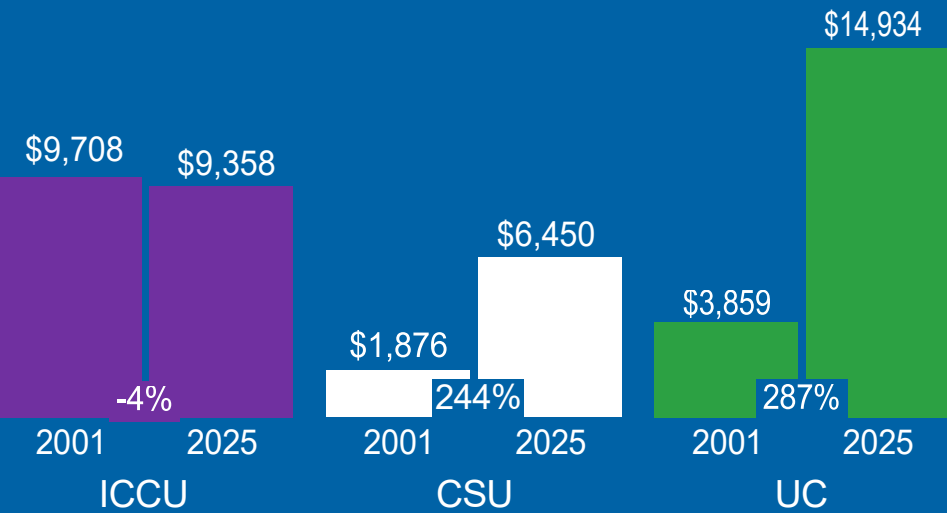

55,903 Undergraduates are Recipients of the Federal Pell Grant

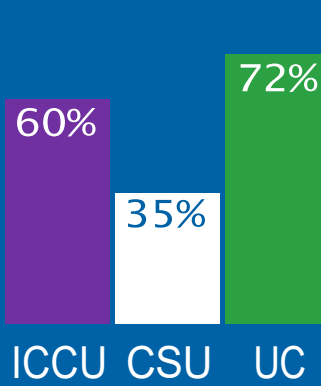

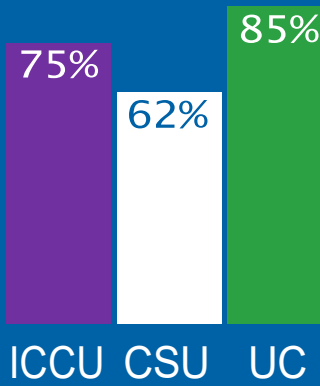

4-Year Graduation Rates by Sector

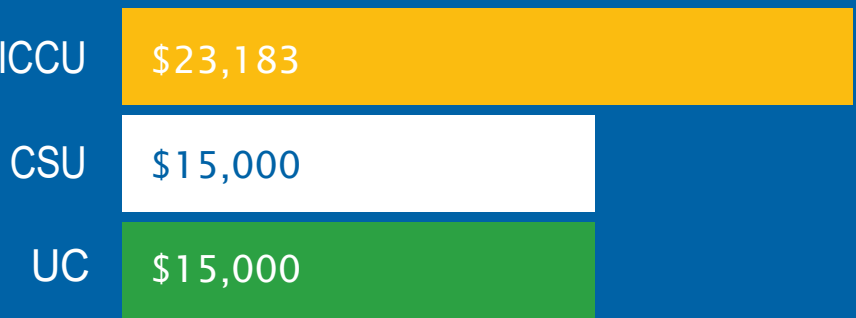


6-Year Graduation Rates by Sector
