

Health Occupations Psychiatric Technician Program

The Psychiatric Technician Program will start a new class every two out of three semesters. *For current information on the next Program start date, please visit the webpage at <u>napavalley.edu/ptec</u>. Applications are due in by the published deadline for the start of the corresponding semester. Each class will have 40 openings, which will be filled by the first 40 applicants who have completed the following procedures.*

BEFORE APPLYING

In order to be accepted into the Psychiatric Technician Program, there are several steps you must complete <u>before you turn in your application for the PTEC Program</u>. Make sure you fully understand what is expected to be done and allow adequate time for requirements such as transcript and Foreign Verification requests.

- Complete an application for admission to Napa Valley College.
 - Do this online at <u>www.napavallev.edu</u>. This only needs to be done once.
- Complete the Course requirements of:
 - High School English with a "C" or better or completion of Basic English and Writing (or higher) with a "C" or better.
 - High School Algebra with a "C" or better or completion of Elementary Algebra (or higher) with a "C" or better.
- Complete the Prerequisite courses:
 - o **HEOC 100** Anatomy and Physiology (with a "C" or better)
 - o **HEOC 101** Pharmacology (with a "C" or better)
 - o **HEOC 172** Nutrition (with a "C" or better)

These classes must be started & completed <u>within 5 years</u> of the start date of the program. These classes do not have to be completed before application to the Psych Tech Program, however **you must be <u>currently enrolled</u>** in the class(es) at the time you submit your application. Similar courses from other community colleges may be accepted with the approval of the program director.

- Highly Recommended: **HEOC 171** Medical Terminology
- Official Transcripts (unopened) of high school graduation or its equivalent (GED, CHSPE) and, if applicable, college courses.
- If Foreign, Official Verification (unopened) of high school graduation or its equivalent (GED, CHSPE) and, if applicable, college courses.

All Foreign Transcripts must be evaluated by an International Evaluation Service prior to submission of program application; this service must provide Napa Valley College with an evaluation certificate of the international coursework.

AT APPLICATION

When you complete your application for the Psychiatric Technician Program, you also need to complete the Checklist (within application). This Checklist will ensure that you are not missing anything that would cause your application to be rejected.

All applicants meeting these requirements will be certified eligible for admission to the program and will be provisionally accepted on a first-come, first-served basis. APPLICANTS THAT MEET ALL THE REQUIREMENTS AND ARE CNA'S, OR HAVE MILITARY EXPERIENCE, WILL BE GIVEN PRIORITY ACCEPTANCE TO THE PROGRAM!

Your application will be rejected if all requirements are not met.

ONCE ACCEPTED

Applicants will be notified by letter of their acceptance into the program. You will be notified in the Acceptance Letter of due dates for submitting copies of your CPR card, health & safety packet, and Drug Screen/Background Check.

• Current CPR Certification

The <u>only acceptable type of certification</u> is the Basic Life Support (BLS) for Healthcare Providers (HCP). Go to www.napacpr.com for further information and available course offerings through the college.

• Drug Screen/Background Check

Information on requirements for Drug Screen/Background Check will come at Orientation.

• Mandatory PTEC Orientation

You must attend the mandatory PTEC Orientation with the Program Director (you will be notified by mail of the date of orientation).

Students who fail to attend PTEC Orientation or fail to submit their required Health & Safety documentation or complete a Drug Screen/Background Check by due dates explained in the acceptance letter, will lose their spot in the program.

DURING THE PROGRAM

Your PTEC program will take three semesters to finish. During these three semesters, in addition to your PTEC classes, you will need to complete co-requisites in order to receive a Certificate of Completion and be able to sit for the BVNPT exam. In order to provide flexibility in the program, you can take the co-requisites either before starting the program or during the summer semester when you have no PTEC class scheduled. (If you take any of the co-requisites before starting the program, they must be started & completed within 5 years of the start date of the program.) Please remember not all courses are always available during summer session.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

- Prior to registering for any courses at NVC, we **strongly** recommend that students make an appointment with a counselor to discuss assessment scores, appropriate course placement, course load, educational and career plans.
- All HEOC courses must be completed with a "C" grade or better and must be started & completed within 5 years of the start date of the program in order to meet Board of Vocational Nursing and Psychiatric Technicians (BVNPT) requirements.
- Due to the fact that during your clinical rotations you will be practicing in off-campus clinical settings, it is especially important that you are aware of professional expectations. You will be expected to follow standards while participating in the Psych Tech program including appearance, attitude, language, and tardy behavior.
- All students will be subject to a drug screen and background check. If an agency determines that a student does not meet hospital security standards, the student will be ineligible for mandatory clinical rotations and will be subject to dismissal from the program.
